I just got a helpful email back from a NYS DOT person. I found some volume data from the NYS DOT site and there was an email address, so I sent an email asking about how to get data for NYC. She sent me the name and contact info for someone at the NYC DOT to contact to get data. They get most of their data from NYC, she said. Will put that on the list, but I have to do a bit of college work first.

Also, I met a person who turns out to be an attorney at the Brownstone Republican meeting who was making specific suggestions about checking on whether there was adequate community notice, etc. He turns out to be an attorney, and could be useful. I'll even work with a Republican to get this thing defeated.
